The New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Abandoned Mine Land Program seeks a registered Professional Engineer to assist in safeguarding and reclaiming New Mexico's abandoned mine lands. The person in this position creates engineering designs and specifications, administers construction contracts, and manages professional services contracts. The person works with a diverse team of engineers, biologists, archaeologists, and others to create designs and specifications that meet project requirements and objectives. The work includes design of closures at abandoned mine openings, including bat compatible closures, and design of reclamation measures, including erosion and sediment control and stream restoration, at abandoned mine sites across the state. The position is in Santa Fe, New Mexico and is 100% federally funded.

**Minimum Qualifications:**

**Education:** Bachelor's degree in Engineering or N.M. State Board of Professional Engineers and Surveyors approved 4-year curriculum as outlined in N.M. Engineering and Surveying Practice Act, Sections 61-23-1 to 32, and

**Experience:** Five (5) years of experience in engineering, design, construction, surveying, transportation system planning, coordinating, infrastructure projects and/or physical science.

**Statutory Requirements:** All applicants for the Advanced Civil Engineering role must be licensed in accordance with Engineering and Surveying Practice Act, Sections 61-23-1 through 61-23-32 NMSA 1978 and 16.39.1 through 16.39.8 NMAC, as applicable. Registration as a Professional Engineer by the New Mexico Licensing Board or the ability to transfer PE registration from another state to New Mexico.

The position is within pay band 80, \$44,782.40 to \$77,916.80 per year, with salary depending on qualifications and experience. Employee benefits include a partially employer paid retirement plan and health care insurance and access to a deferred compensation program.
